QUESTION 2

- 2.1 Briefly explain the development of South Africa from 1800 to 1900, stating the important highlights. (5 × 2) (10)
- 2.2 All levels of government render services to the community. 
Give TEN reasons for rendering services to the community by the local government. (10)
- 2.3 Various factors affect the functioning of municipalities, and physical factors are one of them. 
Describe the influence of geographical factors on the functioning of municipalities. (5 × 2) (10)
- 2.4 Explain FIVE roles played by the premier in the day-to-day running of municipalities. (5 × 2) (10)

QUESTION 3

- 3.1 There is a division of powers between *district* and *local* municipalities.
State only the powers of district municipalities.  (10)
- 3.2 Identify the characteristics of municipal services as prescribed by the Constitution and the Municipal Systems Act. (10)
- 3.3 As a Municipal Administration student, you are approached by a furious resident who was not allowed to vote during the municipal by-elections in your area.
Give her FIVE reasons that she may have been disqualified. (5)
- 3.4 You are appointed to serve in the Demarcation Board of your municipality. During a meeting, one member asks a question about the criteria used to decide the number of wards. 
Assist the board in answering this question. (5 × 2) (10)
- 3.5 The ordinances of provinces forbid councillors from entering into an agreement (contract) with their council.
State FIVE cases in which they will be exempted from the rule. (5)

QUESTION 4

- 4.1 There is a difference between an *executive* and a *non-executive* mayor.
Describe the powers of an executive mayor as set out in section 56(2) of the Local Government: Municipal Structures Act 117 of 1998. (5 × 2) (10)
- 4.2 The executive committee is the principal committee of the council.
State the FIVE purposes of the executive committee.  (5 × 2) (10)
- 4.3 Mrs Galeboe is asked to take minutes during council meetings and to type as well as record them. She does not see the importance or reason for minutes to be taken.
Advise her by giving FIVE reasons that minutes are important. (5 × 2) (10)
- 4.4 Councillors are not trained in meeting procedures. Consequently, council meetings are a disaster. 
Compile TEN procedures to be followed when introducing a motion during a meeting. (10)
