CRISIS MOUNTS FOR TIGER BRANDS

The company has recalled value-added products from its Pretoria facility.

Tiger Brands is recalling yet another batch of products, a move that, along with a class action suit seeking up to R42 million, could take the cost of the listeriosis crisis up to R800 million, which is twice the R324 million in operating profit generated by its snacks, treats and beverages division for the financial year ending September.

On Monday, the food producer recalled all products manufactured at its Value Added Meat Products facility in Pretoria, which includes the Snax range of meat products, due to the detection of listeria monocytogenes.

Tiger Brands was forced to recall its Enterprise polony and vienna products after Health Minister Aaron Motsoaledi announced on Monday that an investigation had traced the ST6 type (LST6) of the listeria bacteria – believed to be behind the outbreak and responsible for 91% of all infections in SA – to Tiger Brands’s factory in Polokwane.
