Read the summary at least TWICE and look for the following:

- Facts and obvious grammatical errors.
- Direct quotes and incomplete sentences.

Facts:

- Tick the seven facts in context according to the marking guidelines.
- Make a definite tick (✓) above the main idea.
- Mark only one fact per sentence.
- Do not award marks if main ideas are out of context.

Language:

- Award 7 marks for 7 facts (F)
- Award 3 marks for language (L)
